EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 05 Series of 2022

AN EXECUTIVE ORDER PROVIDING GUIDELINES IN THE IMPLEMENTATION OF ALERT LEVEL TWO (2) IN THE PROVINCE OF ORIENTAL MINDORO

WHEREAS, On September 10, 2021, the President issued Proclamation No. 1218 (s.2021) further extending the period of the State of Calamity throughout the Philippines until September 12, 2022, unless earlier lifted or extended as circumstances may warrant;

WHEREAS, Executive Order No. 151 (S.2021) dated 11, November 2021 was issued by the President, approving the nationwide implementation of the Alert level System for Covid-19 Response;

WHEREAS, On February 14, 2022, the Inter-Agency Task Force for the Management of Emerging Infectious Diseases (IATF) issued Resolution No. 161-A, placing provinces of Oriental Mindoro and Occidental Mindoro under Alert level 2 from February 16, 2022 to February 28, 2022.

WHEREAS, the IATF-MEID Resolution No. 154, Series of 2021, the Intrazonal and interzonal movement shall be allowed. However, reasonable restrictions may be imposed by the LGUs, which should not be stricter as those prescribed under higher alert levels and subject to the oversight, monitoring, and evaluation of their respective RIATF.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, HUMERLITO A. DOLOR, MPA, Ph.D., by virtue of the powers vested in me by Republic Act No. 7160 of 1991 otherwise known as Local Government Code and other pertinent laws of the Republic of the Philippines as the Provincial Governor of Oriental Mindoro, do hereby promulgate this Executive Order as follows:

SECTION 1. Movement of people entering the province. Only the following are allowed to enter the province:

- a. Unvaccinated persons shall present a result of negative Reverse Transcription -Polymerase Chain Reaction Test (RT- PCR) issued within forty-eight (48) hours before
- b. Fully vaccinated individuals shall present their vaccination cards (two [2] weeks or more after the acquisition of the second dose of a double-dose vaccines, and first dose of a single- dose vaccines);
- c. Drivers and porters of delivery vehicles transporting goods and supplies to the province;
- d. Authorized Persons Outside of Residence (APORs) from National Government Agencies and other relative agencies with identification card (ID), travel order and travel itinerary;
- e. Members of judiciary whose place of assignment is within the province;
- f. Local Chief Executives returning from their official travel with proper travel authority;
- g. APORs from local government units on official travel relative to COVID-19 response of the government;
- h. Ambulance drivers and medical staffs;

- i. Medical practitioners practicing their profession in the province of Oriental Mindoro; and
- j. Persons below eighteen (18) years of age and accompanied by their parent/s and/or guardian/s who shall be fully vaccinated. Otherwise, said parent/s and/or guardian/s must present negative RT-PCR result issued within forty-eight (48) hours before their travel.

The approved Safe, Swift, and Smart Passage (S-Pass) application shall remain as the mandatory requirement to all persons entering the province.

SECTION 2. Truck drivers and porters. Truck drivers and porters of delivery vehicles carrying goods and supplies, and those truck drivers and porters returning to their companies after their deliveries, are not mandated to present a negative RT-PCR test results or vaccination cards before entering the province, but:

- a. Except those residents of Oriental Mindoro, they will not be permitted to alight from their vehicles unless emergency:
- b. Only two (2) persons are allowed for every delivery van (e.i.: Grandia, Urvan, and L300)
- c. Only three (3) persons are allowed for every four-wheel delivery truck (e.i.: drop-side. winged-van, and closed-van); and
- d. Only four (4) persons are allowed for every six-wheel delivery truck and above.

SECTION 3. Movement of persons leaving the province. The following individuals are allowed to travel outside and return to Oriental Mindoro within twenty-four (24) hours from departure, without the need of presenting a negative RT-PCR test result or vaccination cards on their return. to wit:

- A. Emergency travelers who shall acquire medical assistance outside the province;
- B. Lawyers who shall leave the province to attend hearings;
- C. Businessmen who shall travel outside the province to attend business related activities;
- D. Relatives of a deceased family member within the fourth civil degree of consanguinity and affinity, provided that the cause of death is not related to COVID-19; and
- E. Persons who shall acquire their vaccines in Vaccination Centers situated outside the province.

Travelers specified under this section shall strictly observe the twenty-four (24) hour reglementary period to return to the province. Otherwise, he/she shall be subjected to the travel requirements and protocols enumerated in the preceding sections of this Executive Order. The approved Safe, Swift, and Smart Passage (S-PaSS) application shall remain as an indispensable requirement to all persons entering or leaving the province.

SECTION 4. Operational Capacity of Establishments. The following establishments, or activities, shall be allowed to operate, or be undertaken at a maximum of 50% indoor venue capacity for fully vaccinated individuals and those below 18 years of age, even if unvaccinated. and 70% outdoor venue capacity. Provided, that all on-site workers/employees of these establishments, or organizers of activities are fully vaccinated against COVID-19, and MPHS shall be strictly maintained. Provided further, that there is no objection from the LGU where these activities may take place:

a. Venues for meetings, incentives, conferences, and exhibitions (MICE);

- b. Permitted venues for social events such as parties, wedding receptions, engagement parties, wedding anniversaries, debut and birthday parties, family reunions, and bridal or baby showers;
- c. Visitor or tourist attractions such as libraries, archives, museums, galleries, exhibits, parks, plazas, public gardens, scenic viewpoints or overlooks, and the like;
- d. Amusement parks or theme parks;
- e. Recreational venues such as internet cafes, billiard halls, amusement arcades, bowling alleys, skating rinks, archery halls, swimming pools, and similar venues;
- f. Cinemas and movie houses;
- g. Limited face-to-face or in-person classes for basic education subject to prior approval of the Office of the President;
- h. Limited face-to-face or in-person classes for higher education and for technicalvocational education and training:
- i. In-person religious gatherings; gatherings for necrological services, wakes, inurnment, and funerals for those who died of causes other than COVID-19 and for the cremains of the COVID-19 deceased;
- Licensure or entrance/qualifying examinations administered by their respective government agency, and specialty examinations authorized by the IATF subject to health and safety guidelines as approved by the IATF:
- k. Dine-in services of food preparation establishments such as kiosks, commissaries, restaurants, and eateries, subject to DTI sector-specific protocols:
- I. Personal care establishments such as barbershops, hair spas, hair salons, and nail spas, and those offering aesthetic/cosmetic services or procedures, make-up services, salons, spas, reflexology, and other similar procedures including home service options, subject to the sector-specific protocols of the DTI;
- m. Fitness studios, gyms, and venues for individual non-contact exercise and sports; provided that patrons/clients and workers/employees wear face masks at all times and subject to DTI sector-specific protocols.
- n. Film, music, and television production subject to the joint guidelines as may be issued by the DTI, DOLE, and the DOH;
- Contact sports approved by the LGU where such games shall be held;
- p. Funfairs/peryahans or kid amusement industries such as playgrounds, playroom, and kiddie rides;
- q. Venues with live voice or wind-instrument performers and audiences such as in karaoke bars, clubs, concert halls, and theaters; and
- Gatherings in residences with individuals not belonging to the same household.
- SECTION 5. Operational Capacity of Public Offices. Agencies and instrumentalities of the government shall remain to be fully operational and shall adhere to at least a 80% on-site workforce. Those assigned to work off-site shall be subject to alternative work arrangements as approved by the head of agency in accordance with the relevant rules and regulations issued by the Civil Service Commission (CSC). Heads of agencies providing health and emergency frontline services, laboratory and testing services, border control, or other critical services shall operate at a workforce beyond the minimum as may be necessary to deliver their mandates.

SECTION 6. General Precautionary Health Measures. To effectively contain the spread of COVID-19, all persons are hereby mandated to continually adhere to the minimum health standards prescribed by the Department of Health, viz:

- a. Mandatory wearing of face mask at all times. Face masks made from cloth must be double-layered or must be ware with filter such as tissue paper to ensure protection from probable transmission of the virus;
- b. Mandatory physical distancing. Especially in public places, each person are mandated to observe at least one and one half (1.5) meters physical distance from each other;
- Mandatory hand disinfection by the use of alcohol in between transactions;

SECTION 7. No vaccine, No transaction policy. Except for medical and social services, PGOM will only transact with fully vaccinated individuals. Only fully vaccinated ambulatory vendors and delivery personnel are allowed within the premises of PGOM offices.

In PGOM owned and operated hospitals, only fully vaccinated individuals are allowed to act as patient's watcher. One Patient One Watcher and No Visitor policies will also be implemented.

The policy of No Dalaw will also be implemented in all PGOM Detention Facilities.

SECTION 8. Penalty. Any person who shall present or use falsified documentary requirements in his/her TCP application shall be criminally/administratively prosecuted. Any violation of the provisions under this Executive Order may lead to legal actions against any person.

SECTION 9. Separability Clause. If any provision of this Executive Order is found to be unconstitutional or inconsistent with any national or local laws, ordinances, or resolutions, all the other provisions thereof shall remain in full force and applicable.

SECTION 10. Repealing Clause. All executive orders, rules, and regulations or parts thereof issued by the Provincial Government of Oriental Mindoro inconsistent with this Executive Order are hereby amended, repealed and/or modified accordingly.

SECTION 11. Effectivity. This Executive Order shall take effect immediately upon its approval.
