EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 18

Series of 2022

AN EXECUTIVE ORDER REORGANIZING THE PROVINCIAL SCHOOL BOARD, PROVIDING FOR ITS FUNCTIONS, AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES

WHEREAS, under Article XIV, Section 1, of the 1987 Philippine Constitution, the State shall protect and promote the right of all citizens to quality education at all levels and shall take appropriate steps to make such education accessible to all;

WHEREAS, under the Section 98 of the Local Government Code of 1991, there shall be established in every province, city, or municipality, a provincial, city, or municipal school board, respectively;

WHEREAS, due to the annual election for president of the Provincial Federation of Parent-Teacher Association, there is a need to reorganize the composition of the Provincial School Board to update the organizational changes in its members;

NOW THEREFORE, I, HUMERLITO A. DOLOR, MPA, PH.D., by virtue of the powers vested in me by Republic Act No. 7160 and other pertinent laws of the Republic of the Philippines as the Provincial Governor of Oriental Mindoro, do hereby promulgate this Executive Order, as follows:

SECTION 1. Reorganization. The Provincial School Board is hereby reorganized with the following composition:

SECTION 2. Functions. The Provincial Health Board shall perform the following functions:

- a. Determine, in accordance with the criteria set by the Department of Education, the annual supplementary budgetary needs for the operation and maintenance of public schools and the supplementary local cost of meeting such needs, which shall be reflected in the form of an annual school board budget corresponding to its share of the proceeds of the special levy on real property constituting the Special Education Fund and such other sources of revenue as may be provided by the Local Government Code of 1991 and other laws or ordinances;
- b. Authorize the Provincial Treasurer to disburse funds from the Special Education Fund pursuant to the budget prepared and in accordance with existing rules and regulations;
- c. Serve as an advisory committee to the Sanggunian concerned on educational matters such as, but not limited to, the necessity for and the uses of local appropriations for educational purposes; and
- d. Recommend changes in the names of public schools within the territorial jurisdiction of the local government unit for enactment by the Sanggunian concerned.

SECTION 3. Meetings, Quorum, and Budget. The Provincial School Board shall meet at least once every quarter or as often as may be necessary.

A majority of all its members shall constitute a quorum. However, when both co-chairmen are present in a meeting, the local chief executive concerned, as a matter of protocol, shall be given preference to preside over the meeting. The division superintendent, city superintendent or district supervisor, as the case may be, shall prepare the budget of the school board concerned. Such budget shall be supported by programs, projects, and activities of the school board for the ensuing fiscal year. The affirmative vote of the majority of all the members shall be necessary to approve the budget.

The Annual School Board budget shall give priority to the following (pursuant to the Local Government Code of 1991, as amended, and DBM-DepEd-DILG Joint Circular Nos. 1, series of 2017 and 2020):


1. Operations and maintenance of public schools;
2. Health and sanitation expenses;
3. Construction and repair of school buildings;
4. Facilities and equipment;
5. Educational research;
6. Purchase of books and periodicals;
7. Sports development; and
8. Funding for the early childhood care and development (ECCD) program.

SECTION 5. Separability Clause. If any provision of this Executive Order is declared invalid, illegal, or unconstitutional, the parts not affected shall remain valid and in full force.

SECTION 6. Repealing Clause. All executive orders, rules and regulations, issuances, or parts thereof inconsistent with this Executive Order are hereby amended, repealed and/or modified accordingly.

SECTION 7. Effectivity. This Executive Order shall take effect immediately upon its approval.
