EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 17 SERIES OF 2024

AN EXECUTIVE ORDER REORGANIZING THE PROVINCIAL SCHOOL BOARD, PROVIDING FOR ITS FUNCTIONS, AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES

WHEREAS, Section 1, Article XIV of the 1987 Philippine Constitution directs the State to protect and promote the right of all citizens to quality education at all levels and to take appropriate steps to make such education accessible to all.

WHEREAS, Section 98 of Republic Act No. 7160, otherwise known as the Local Government Code of 1991, requires the establishment of a local school board in every province, city, and municipality.

WHEREAS, on 31 May 2022, Executive Order (EO) No. 18, Series of 2022 was issued to reorganize the Provincial School Board of Oriental Mindoro.

WHEREAS, there is a need to update the composition of Oriental Mindoro's Provincial School Board.

NOW THEREFORE, I, HUMERLITO A. DOLCR, MPA, PH.D., by virtue of the powers vested in me as Provincial Governor of Oriental Mindoro by Local Government Code of 1991, do hereby promulgate this Executive Order as follows:

SECTION 1. Reorganization. The Provincial School Board of Oriental Mindoro is hereby further reorganized and shall be composed of the following:

SECTION 2. Functions. The Provincial School Board shall perform the following functions:

- A. Determine, in accordance with the criteria set by the Department of Education, the annual supplementary budgetary needs for the operation and maintenance of public schools and the supplementary local cost of meeting such needs, which shall be reflected in the form of an annual school board budget corresponding to its share of the proceeds of the special levy on real property constituting the Special Education Fund, and such other sources of revenue as may be provided by the Local Government Code of 1991 and other laws, issuances, rules and regulations, or ordinances.
- B. Authorize the Provincial Treasurer by appropriate resolution to disburse funds from the Special Education Fund pursuant to the budget prepared and in accordance with existing rules and regulations.
- C. Serve as an advisory committee to the Sanggunian concerned on educational matters such as, but not limited to, the necessity for and the uses of local appropriations for educational purposes;
- D. Recommend changes in the names of public schools within the territorial jurisdiction of the local government unit for enactment by the Sanggunian concerned; and
- E. Perform other functions mandated by other pertinent laws and issuances.

SECTION 3. Meetings, Quorum, and Budget. The Provincial School Board shall meet at least once a month or as often as may be necessary.

A majority of its members shall constitute a quorum. However, when both co-chairpersons are present in a meeting, the Local Chief Executive (LCE) concerned, as a matter of protocol, shall be given preference to preside over the meeting. Further, the LCE is given the prerogative to appoint any other member to act as presiding officer. The division superintendent, city superintendent or district supervisor, as the case may be, shall prepare the budget of the school board concerned. Such budget shall be supported by programs, projects, and activities of the school board for the ensuing fiscal year. The

affirmative vote of the majority of all the members shall be necessary to approve the budget.

The Annual School Board budget shall give priority to funding the following:

- A. Operation and maintenance of public schools
- B. Health and sanitation expenses
- C. Construction and repair of school buildings
- D. Facilities and equipment

SECTION 4. Secretariat. The Provincial Public Employment Service Office (PESO) shall render Secretariat services to the Provincial School Board.

SECTION 5. Repealing Clause. All provincial orders, rules and regulations inconsistent and contrary to the provisions of the Executive Order are hereby repealed and/or modified accordingly.

SECTION 6. Separability Clause. If any provision if this Executive Order is declared invalid, illegal, or unconstitutional, the parts not affected shall remain valid and in full force and effect.

SECTION 7. Effectivity. This Executive Order shall take effect immediately upon
