EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 23 Series of 2024

AN EXECUTIVE ORDER REORGANIZING THE PROVINCIAL COMMUNITY - BASED MONITORING SYSTEM (CBMS) COORDINATING BOARD

WHEREAS, on 17 April 2019, Republic Act (RA) No. 11315 otherwise known as Community – Based Monitoring System (CBMS) Act, was enacted to institutionalize the conduct of CMBS in every city and municipality in the country.

WHEREAS, the CBMS is an organized technology – based system of collecting, processing, and validating necessary disaggregated data utilized in planning, program implementation, and impact monitoring in the local level;

WHEREAS, CBMS Council Resolution No. 06, Series of 2021 enjoins the establishment of a Provincial and City/Municipal Coordinating Board that will be responsible for overseeing the CBMS operations in their respective locality, ensuring logistic and other requirements are in place prior and during the CBMS operations, and resolving issues and concerns encountered in the conduct of CBMS in their jurisdiction;

WHEREAS, on 7 April 2022, Executive Order No. 14, Series of 2022 was issued to organize the Provincial Community – Based Monitoring System Coordinating Board of Oriental Mindoro;

WHEREAS, on 01 April 2022, the CBMS Council approved Resolution No. 1, Series of 2022 to amend the composition of the Provincial and City/Municipality Community — Based Monitoring System Coordinating Boards;

NOW THEREFORE, I, HUMERLITO A. DOLOR, MPA, Ph.D., by virtue of the power vested in me as the Provincial Governor of Oriental Mindoro by Republic Act 7160, otherwise known as the Local Government of 1991 and other pertinent laws and issuances, do hereby promulgate this Executive Order as follows:

SECTION 1. Reorganization. The Provincial Community – Based Monitoring System Coordinating Board shall be composed of the following:

SECTION 2. Duties and Function. The Provincial CBMS Coordinating Board shall perform the following functions:

- 1. Oversee the implementation of the CBMS operations in the province and report status to the concerned Regional Statistical Committee (RSC).
- 2. Resolve issues and concerns encountered in the conduct of CBMS. For issues that cannot be resolved at the provincial level, the Board shall escalate the issues and concerns to the concerned PSA Regional Statistical Services Offices and RSCs through the RCCBs.
- 3. Facilitate the approval and timely release of funds (if any) and/or other requirements for the conduct of CBMS.
- 4. Issue communications, directives, instructions, and/or circulars to cooperate, mobilize, and provide support/assistance to the CBMS operations, which shall include but are not limited to the conduct/provision of the following:
 - a. Active participation in coordination meetings and activities;
 - b. Publicity and information campaign for the conduct of CBMS;
 - c. Venue for the training conduct, headquarters for the enumeration personnel, and machine processing;
 - d. Transportation facilities for the enumeration personnel, and transport of CBMS forms, supplies, and materials;
 - e. Communication and wireless internet connection facility;
 - f. Storage area for tablets, forms, and other material;
 - g. Health and legal services to CBMS personnel; and
 - h. Facilitation of enumeration in government owned and private institutions, and other hard - to - reach areas.
- 5. Take up other matters as necessary for the successful conduct of the CBMS.

SECTION 3. Repealing Clause. All Executive Orders or issuances inconsistent with the provisions of this Executive Order are hereby repealed or modified accordingly.

SECTION 4. Effectivity. This Executive Order shall take effect immediately upon signing hereof.
